Background of YCAP

- There was a youth dialogue in 2008 in Cape Town organised by Afrika Tikkun
- In 2009, the event took place again and a similar event was held in Johannesburg, organised by Amanda (on behalf of Afrika Tikkun)
- Found no actions or follow through after the dialogue, where youth came up with solutions to their problems (SA problems)

Take Action

- In 2010 the Youth Citizens Action Programme was formed by a committee headed by Amanda
- The programme uses the Heartlines Values Booklet for youth that has simple project management steps
- An incentive of a provincial and national monetary prize and event was added (sponsored by the funder, Deutsche Bank)
- The programme is implemented by the Department of Basic Education in all 9 provinces for past 5 years

EMPOWERVATE

- In 2013, Amanda left Afrika Tikkun and invited former colleagues Pamela Hendriks and Arshaad Moosa to join as trustees to start the youth development NPO, Empowervate Trust
- Empowervate powers the YCAP programme as well as other initiatives that relate to the empowering and motivation of young people, such as entrepreneurship
- Empowervate's aim is to empower and motivate the youth so they can be positive active citizens

How YCAP works

- When looking for material to assist learners in finding problems and creating and implementing solutions, we decided to use a problem solving method found in the HEARTLINES Values booklet
- The YCAP toolkit consists of the printed document with all the details about YCAP itself – the rules, timelines etc as well as the Heartlines booklet, which we are redesigning next year

Step 1: Map the Challenge

- Form a group of 5 to 10 people
- Draw a Map of the School and show clearly where the problem areas are by writing them on the map in the areas where they occur
- Visual representation makes this more concrete and less abstract – easier to identify the problems

Step 2: Understand the problem

- List the problems
- Explain what each problem is about (causes, effects, culprits)

Step 3: Choose the Action

- After choosing one of the problems to be the topic for this project, list all the possible solutions for solving the problem
- Choose the best solutions

Step 4: Plan the Action

- Draw a table that states what needs to be done, who will do it, by when and what's needed
- Complete the table for each solution

Step 5: Do the Action

 Revise the plan with what actually happened while doing the action (dates may change, people may change, actions may change)

Step 6: Review and Revise

- Ask your team to discuss the impact of the project – what worked, what didn't work, was there a difference in the problem from before the project to after?
- Also discuss how you worked as a team values learned, challenges faced
- Reflect on personal learnings confidence, leadership ability, presentation skills gained

Step 7: Complete the Project

- Keep motivated ask your team to continue working on the project and/or think of starting a new one too
- Put together your portfolio
- Choose how you will present the project as a team, the best speakers should do the talking

Step 8: Talk about it

- Communication is key speak at assembly or get the media involved to showcase your project
- Show the impact your team made and continues to make
- Encourage more people to join you as you become active citizens for a better South Africa!

Highlights

- All nine provinces participated
- Record number of schools 356 (with about 3500 learners)
- Highest number of learners at National Championships in Durban – 88 in 2014 (2013 was 18)
- There were diverse topics that were either quite small and concrete or huge and based on awareness
- In 2015, Grade 7 category was added


How to participate in YCAP 2016
